


**Arches, Angles, and Trapezoids (continued)**

For an assisted-living center, interior designer Chris Newman, Capauls Floor Coverings, Tomah, WI, sought a solution for four large arched windows in the dining room. Staff and residents enjoyed the hillside view of birds and wildlife. However, the western exposure meant that afternoon sun created glare and heat, especially in the summer.

Adjust-a-View™ arched window treatments allowed Newman to save the view while controlling heat and glare. To preserve the design theme, the same cellular-shade material was used on the lower windows as well. Adjust-a-View arched window treatments in half- and quarter-circles are products of Omega Manufacturing Corp., of Two Rivers, WI. Omega will introduce a moveable arch system for elliptical, eyebrow-style windows later this year.

Top) Adjust-a-View shades can be closed to various positions. Staff can adjust shades to block sun from disturbing individual residents while preserving as much view as possible.

Left and right) The shades can be fully opened for maximum view, while the low profile of the system doesn't obstruct the view. When closed, the arch and lower shades match to preserve the design scheme.
